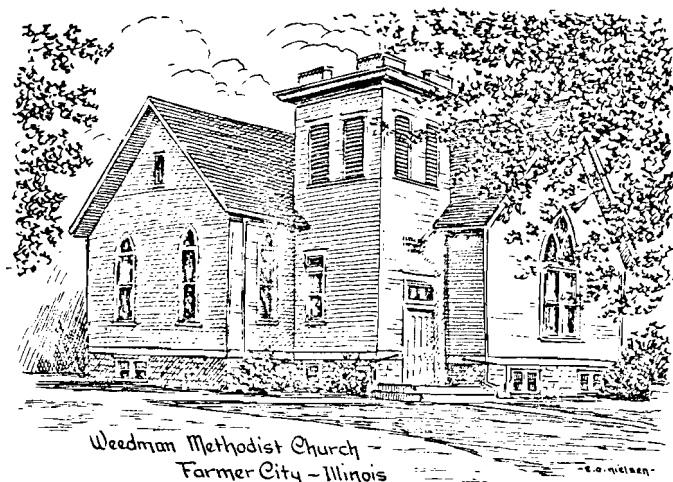
The picture to the right is of the Weedman Methodist Church at Weedman, Illinois (although the mailing address is Farmer City.) There is actually hardly a town there any more, but we saw the sign posts saying WEEDMAN just as you come to this wide place in the road.

The Church looks just like this picture. Thought you'd all enjoy seeing it. Weedman was named after the Ohio to Illinois branch of the Weedman Family. They settled mostly in McLean and DeWitt Counties in Illinois. (See June 1969 Newsletter, and also Sept. & Dec. of that year for details on this part

of the family. While I am at it, I want to correct an error that occurred in the reading of the abstract of the will of the Weedman ancestor we called J. Christian Weedman. I read this film again after going to a class on "How To Read Old Style Writing". Seeing copies of several wills, I became uneasy that what I had thought was a "J", or rather what the sender of this item, Pat Crespi, thought was a "J" may have actually been an "I". It was. The will reads, "I, CHRISTIAN WEEDMANetc." So please, everybody, get out your December 1970 Newsletters, and on Page 17, change this to read simply Christian Weedman. In other words, we may assume now that Christian Weedman who moved to Kentucky was actually Christian Weedman, Jr. Christian Weedman, Sr. and most of his children moved to Ohio, and his son, George, who would be Christian Jr.'s brother, is the ancestor of all of the McLean and DeWitt County Illinois Weedman lines. Although there were other Weedman brothers who went to Ohio with George, we do not have their lines as yet. Mrs. Pierre (Frances Weedman) Miles sent me much information on George's line. More information on these Weedman descendants will appear in this newsletter.

Elizabeth Snodgrass sent several family sheets for further information on the descendants of WILLIAM WEEDMAN, brother of DANIEL, JACOB, JOHN & ELIZABETH. She also sent the address of Harry Weedman, a cousin in Arkansas, who will be a receiver of the Newsletter from now on. Harry's address is: 114 E. Davis Street, P.O. Box 1293, Blytheville, Arkansas 72315. If you will get out your December, 1968 Newsletter, you can add some things to the information contained, therein, and I hope you will all take the time to do this, so as to keep the records as accurate as possible. Thank you, Betty, for sending us his information, and those family group sheets, which make it so easy to follow.

On page 2 of December 1968's Newsletter, there is a discrepancy of dates as follows: Harry Weedman's information on Greene Berry Weedman is that he was born Aug. 20 1833 and died Jan. 6 1909. He is buried at Methodist Grove Cemetery, Newberry, Tenn., and his first wife, Susan Cart is buried at Cart Cemetery, Rono, Indiana.



Those are all the changes in that Newsletter, and before I go on to listing more of the descendents of Green Berry Weedman, son of WILLIAM, I want to share with you a little of Betty Snodgrass's letter concerning her own family: their son, Wayne Snodgrass was in Panama for six weeks, taking a final course in tropical medicine. He is now through with Medical School, and is now at Indiana University at Bloomington to do research on birth control, and to to get his Ph.D in Pharmacology. We are happy to get this news. Also Betty tells us that she was expecting a visit from George Riley Weedman, who lives in Three Rivers, Michigan. George is Harry's brother.

Of the children of Green Berry Weedman, we listed descendents of George Perry Weedman, and also of Joe and Mary Etta (Weedman) Davison, and now, to add to this family, are the families of Charles Green Weedman, Ella Weedman and Margaret Weedman. This will complete the information we have on hand for Green Berry's children --- and in addition, we have more information on George Perry's children, too.

I'm in favor of listing them on family group sheets if you can get them. Many libraries and DAR as well as Historical Societies and Genealogical Societies sell Family Group Sheets, and if you do it that way, you won't get all the William's, and Margaret's mixed up. There are so many names in the various families which are almost alike, that we admit it does make it difficult. However, it can't be helped, as the information on one family alone does not all come in at once, so we have to do it piece meal, which is all right, as long as we have it. Keep sending those records, cousins.

Ella Weedman, sister of Charles Green Weedman was born in Rono, Indiana 2 Sep. 1866. She married 24 August, 1890, and died 1 Oct. 1921. Her husband was Jacob Gelzer, born 20 Dec. 1858 Allegheny County, New York. He was, sad to say, murdered by a neighbor in Newbern, Tenn. His parents were Jacob Sr. & Catherine Gelzer. They had the following children, all born in Newbern, Tennessee: (Jacob was killed by a neighbor who didn't want a fence erected by Jacob separating their property. Died of gunshot wound.)

George Perry Weedman, whose children were listed in Dec. 1968 Newsletter was the grandfather of Elizabeth (Weedman) Snodgrass, and we are grateful to her for all the help she has given us on his descendents. We listed his son, Ralph's family in that same Dec. Newsletter. We didn't have Lloyd's family to list then, but we have it now. Lloyd would be a grandson of Green Berry Weedman, son of WILLIAM.

If this seems confusing, I'll repeat Sadie Weedman's way of keeping them all straight, and ours, too, since we saw Sadie's book; she makes family group charts of each family listed in the Newsletter, then files them according to family.

Rachel C. Weedman, daughter of David and Rebecca (Crecelius) Weedman was born about 1846. She married Bailey J. Brown 20 Apr. 1871. They are listed in the 1880 census. After his death she married Henry Stroud. This also is stated in the Mauck Tucker Compilation of Crawford Co. Indiana families on film at the LDS Library at Salt Lake City, Utah.

CHRISTIAN WEEDMAN, Jr. who settled in Grayson Co., Ky. had at least one daughter. Her name was Elizabeth, and Eileen Gochenour has sent us this information on her family:

Hosea Stone was the brother of Polly Stone, who married JOHN WEEDMAN. JOHN is one brother who stayed in Kentucky, and believed to be the ancestor of the Grayson Co. Ky. Weedmans: Alton & Sherman Weedman's families, and their brother Harrell, sister Marelda; and also of Gena Theiss. (See July 1968 Newsletter, also pp. 11 & 13 of 1970 Newsletters. In the 1850 and 1860 censuses, John is married to Elizabeth Weedman. Obviously, Polly Stone Weedman died before 1847, and the Willis listed with them is of John's first marriage. JOHN Weedman was born 1793, and one can never tell sometimes by reading consecutive censuses, as ages never seem to match up. Please make a note in the July 1968 Newsletter that Elizabeth was JOHN's second wife, and insert that his first wife was Polly Stone. She is buried at Beaverdons Cemetary Grayson County, Kentucky.

After Elizabeth (Weedman) Stone died in 1825, Hosea married again and had 12 more children. He had 18 altogether. Here are his children by 2nd wife, Artemetia (Morris) Stone:

The ancestor was George Weedman, son of Christian Weedman Sr. who went to Illinois from Ohio, where he had lived after settling there from Fayette Co., Penna. Christian Sr. died in the part of Fairfield Co., O., which is now Perry Co., O. The Dec. 1969 Newsletter features this family, and more details are to follow in a future Newsletter.

March 1972, page 2, In the listing of Harry Edwin Weedman's children, down toward the bottom of the page, his last daughter is named Billie, not Betty.

Thank you, alert cousins, for calling these errors to our attention. We do appreciate it, and consider it very important to get the record straight.

Received a letter from Edna Dovel. She's a descendent of NICHOLAS WEEDMAN, who married Elizabeth Charley. Edna relates that their daughter, Mary Ann, who married David Ackerman, and raised 9 children, had a very busy life. Made her own wool, cooked, weaved, and gardened. The more popular David became, the harder she worked. Some of David's many accomplishments were: medicine, church work, singing teacher, and hardware and coffin dealer. David was game to try anything, and was a very successful man at anything he set his hand to. Edna tells us the first part of their married life was spent in Reading, Ohio, then near Springfield, Illinois, and then Clarinda, Iowa, Riverton, Iowa, then a few years in Nebraska, then back to Riverton, Iowa where she died in 1910. David Ackerman's folks were in the Cincinnati, Ohio region at one time.

Edna & Earl Dovel's son Bryan Dovel's youngest girl Jayne Dovel married in 1971 Rex Addair. Bryan's wife is the former Doris Story Bennett.

This family above are all descendants of DANIEL WEEDMAN, son of CHRISTIAN, JR, through Daniel's son, Jacob Weedman.

You will remember seeing the name STEPHEN WEEDMAN in the Perry County 1840 census (page 15, December 1970 Newsletter. Wiona (Weedman) Myers is a descendent, and sent us some information on him. Lillian Lefflin sent us a Biographical sketch of one of his children. This information we share with you now.

Stephen Weedman was born in 1806 in Greyson County, Kentucky near Leitchfield. He engaged in farming, house carpentering, flatboat building and other mechanical labor. He lived in Perry County, Indiana for awhile, but seems to have returned to Kentucky, settling in Meade County. He married Mary Gilbert, of Breckinridge Co., Ky. about 1824, and they lived in that county for several years. To this union were born the following children:

A. M. Weedman, (Addison M.) b. 2 Oct. 1826 Breckinridge Co., Ky. m. Louisa, daughter of William and Nancy (Lasley) Brown on Oct. 18, 1851. He died 25 Aug. 1908.

Daniel R. Weedman b. 24 Mar. 1833 Breckinridge Co., Ky., m. 16 Jan. 1879 in Phillips Co., Arkansas, Martha Thompson Connally. He died in Phillips Co., 23 Feb. 1905. They had one son, George R. Weedman.

Sad news came to us in learning of the death on August 3, 1972, of Guy Weedman, descendent of DANIEL, which occurred after Guy had had another sick spell. Albert Giles Ackerman (desc. NICHOLAS WEEDMAN) and wife Anna Amelia Lungershausen Ackerman had a hard life it would seem to us today. Although only 15 at the time of his father's death, Albert did make an unsuccessful attempt to run the homeplace, which, at his age, was quite an undertaking. His son Homer Clifford Ackerman, father of Doris (Ackerman) Kizer, moved from Iowa to South Dakota where all of his children were born. His wife Bertha, was the daughter of Oliver David and Ida May (Kerns) Plumb. Bertha was born 9 Aug. 1889 in Piatt Co., Ill., and died Apr. 29, 1959 at Glendive, Montana. Among some of the memories Doris has of Montana are one of a flood which washed away all their possessions. Later they were able to salvage part of their home, but Homer and Bertha made the best of it and started over again. A cyclone which destroyed a sleeping room where Ray and Art Ackerman, Doris' brothers were sleeping, was next to befall them. Luckily the boys were uninjured, but others had bruises to show for making the rescue. The family then moved to Glendive, Montana.

I will do the DANIEL Weedman line, and we need volunteers for the NICHOLAS, JOHN, JACOB, STEPHEN, and any other lines that come to our attention. We'll also send him what we have on DAVID's line, although David was probably a son of JOHN or WILLIS, both of whom remained in Greyson County. (Willis Sr...... not the one who married Cassa Collard). This is something that will take some time, so we won't rush you, Nick. These charts will be a blessing to us all, as they will trace the lines back, and as we mention various ones in the Newsletter, you can turn to the chart from which they descend, and spot them with little trouble.

Can anybody identify these people? In the Tell City News, it mentions that 20 years ago, Mr. & Mrs. David Weedman received a telegram stating that their son, Corp. Mervin B. Weedman had been wounded in Korea on November 22. We have no record of this Weedman family.

The next three pages will be vital records accumulated in our files. Some may have been noted previously, but most are first timers. Thanks to all who contributed this information: Nick Weedman, Lillian Laflin, Doris Kizer and Gena Theiss.

On page 17, December 1970 Newsletter, under John Weedman's family, change "Marian" to Mariah.

WILLIAM WEEDMAN and JOHN WEEDMAN, sons of CHRISTIAN JR. both served in the War of 1812. William served with Capt. Nichols Company, 7th Regt. U.S. Army - rank; Private. John served in Capt. William Walker's Company, 3rd. Regt. Kentucky Volunteers, U.S. Army with the rank of Private.

Daniel R. Weedman, son of STEPHEN & Mary (Gilbert) WEEDMAN, served as Lieutenant in the Confederate Cavalry. Service from 14 Aug. 1862 till May 29, 1865, where he was at the close of the war, in Washington, Georgia.

Myram Weedman, son of STEPHEN, served as Private in the 5th Regt., Kentucky Infantry. He enlisted on 2 October 1861 and some records show that he was killed in the Battle of Shiloh on 7 Apr. 1862, but still another record says he was captured on "Island # 10" on Apr. 8, 1862 and returned or exchanged on 5 Oct. 1862. On 23 July 1864 he was wounded, but it doesn't say where he was at the time. Still another record says he was among the prisoners at Camp Douglas, Illinois, on 1 Aug. 1862. It says he was captured at Pittsburgh. We do know that he survived to marry and raise a family, so all's well that ends well.

I would presume that the Thomas Weedman mentioned above is the middle name of one of the children of WILLIAM WEEDMAN. People in those days used their middle names more than people do today.

This concludes the 1870 Perry Co. census. For additional census (1880) see Dec. 1970 and March 1971 Newsletters.

The 1880 Soundex censuses include only those households where there was a child 10 or under, therefore, they are not always indicative of all the families in an area, but they do tell where Weedmans settled. Then we look at the 1880 regular census microfilms to find the other families where the people did not have children young enough to qualify to be listed in the 1880 Soundex. Just what the purpose of that was, I don't know. Following, are some Kentucky listings for Weedman families in the 1880 Soundex. You will note that Mordecai Weedman's family is listed in Union Co., Ky. But when we got the regular Union Co. Ky. Census for 1880, we found no Weedmans at all on it. Whoever puts those Soundex statistics together is capable of error, I would say, nevertheless, we'll record it like it reads.
