# Marianne Montgomery's Memo

**Dear Cousins** 

Again we greet you, a bit early this time, for we want to add to the Reunion News and while we're at it, add news and updates on old news.

The Christmas mail brought several letters and I was most happy to hear from you who sent them.

We received a letter from Sally Lawlor with a contribution for the Newsletter. Sally is descended from **JACOB**, son of Christian Weedman, Sr. and brother of **Christian. Jr**. Jacob came to Kentucky probably after Christian Jr. and they settled in the different areas of the State. Jacob is first found in Bullit County, KY where he married Mary Frances (Fannie) Fleming in 1799. Christian was in Kentucky by 1789 when he married in Mercer Co., KY and lived in Somerset, Hardin and Grayson Co., KY. Jacob was an officer in the Cornstalk Militia in Bullit County and then was in Crawford & Dubois Counties in Indiana.

Among the children of this couple, Jonathan Weedman, b. 4 Oct. 1811 in Crawford Co. Indiana, married Frances BALLARD ca 1831. Frances died about 1838 or 1839 in DuBois County, IN, and Jonathan then married, Sarah BRUNER in 1839/40. Sarah was a daughter of Henry and Nancy (Rusher) Bruner.

Children of Jonathan and Frances (Ballard) Weedman were: Jacob F.,

born 1832; Mary Ann Bathsheba, 1835; and Richard Calvin, 1838.

By his second wife, Sarah Bruner, the following children were: William Henry Harrison, born 1841; Malinda, 1842; Allen Fleming, 1845; Sarah Elizabeth, 1846 Rebecca Frances, 1849, and Erastus Emory, 1850.

**Sally Lawlor** is descended from the **Weedmans** and the **Bruners**. She sent this message:

I descend from Jacob Bruner of Martin County, Indiana. There's a book in print about this Bruner family but I haven't been able to find a copy of it. Does anyone in the family know how to obtain a copy? Please contact Sally Lawlor at jagger@kconline.com or at 604 Robson, Winona Lake, IN 46590.

We have some **BRUNER** connections that receive the Newsletter. Hope you will get in contact with Sally if you can answer her question. The above outline of **Jonathan Weedman's** family is to acknowledge an error concerning the two wives: **Frances**

July 1822. Then **Andrew Walters, Jr.** married **Sarah Risen** 20 May 1824. (Perhaps this **Andrew** was the same one who married **Miss Dillon**—sometimes the Junior is left out when the marriage is recorded. It can be confusing, but ultimately it all seems to get righted.

It is believed that **Andrew Walters**, **Sr**. re-married (**Judge Sumner Walters** believes it was to **Elizabeth Dillon**) and that he died there in 1831 or slightly earlier.

There remains much to do to sort out the Walters connection to the Weedmans.

### How Did Willis and Green Become Such Prevalent Family Names?

There are a number of family members who had names of Willis Green, Willis, or Green Weedman. A close examination of the Weedman family shows that virtually all of these had Grayson Co., KY roots. It appears that the Green family was prominent in Grayson County in the early 1800s and that some of the Weedman offspring were named in honor of this family. Perhaps some of our family worked for the Greens.

Willis Green was born in Madison Co., KY in 1795 and was a volunteer in the War of 1812. After the War, he began to trade tobacco down the Mississippi River to New Orleans. In 1829 he bought two hundred acres of land around the Falls of Rough in Grayson Co. Willis Green prospered and he became a prominent member of the local community. In 1839 the Whig Party elected him to the U.S. House of Representatives where he served three terms. He was very active in Henry Clay's campaign for the Presidency in 1844.

In the late 1850s, the businesses of Willis

Green were turned over to his nephew, Lafayette Green. Lafayette was a graduate of the University of Kentucky and the University of Louisville Law School. He died in 1907 and family businesses including the Green Farms General Store passed to his sons, one of whom was another Willis Green. The businesses remained in the family until a daughter, Jennie, died in 1965.

The Green Farms General Store is today a museum that contains much memorabilia of the Green family. It is listed in the National Register of Historic Places and the Green farm is a Kentucky Sesquicentennial Farm.

The Weedman family was in Grayson County from the early 1800s when Christian, Jr. and Mary (Marshall) Weedman settled there. Christian died sometime in the 1830s. A number of his grandsons and members of future generations were named no doubt in honor of Willis Green.

#### Barbara Weedman Riffle Kern

Barbara Weedman (ca 1763 – ca 1837) was a daughter of Christian, Sr. and Elizabeth Weedman. Her marriage to Nicholas Riffle, a Revolutionary War veteran, has been fairly well documented. They lived in Fayette Co., PA and remained there when most of the family moved to Perry and Licking Co., OH.

**Nicholas,** who died in 1808, is buried in the Jacob's Lutheran Church cemetery in Fayette Co., PA but no stone is there for **Barbara**. However, information contributed by those researching the Riffle family gives us new leads to pursue regarding her resting place.

Following the death of **Nicholas Riffle**, his widow married **Michael Kern**, **Sr**. of Morgantown, Virginia (now West Virginia). From a history of Morgantown, WV **Robert Riffle** has contributed the following information:

"...Michael Kerns was a small, heavy set man, weighing about 170 pounds. [That IS strange. He must have been really short to be "heavy set" at 170!] He came from Holland and was at the site of Morgantown in 1772. He married Susan Weatherhold, a widow, in Westmoreland County, Penn. Their children were: Michael, Jr., who married Catherine Criss; Christina Jones, Susan Stealy and John. After the death of his wife, Michael Kerns married a widow RIF-**FLE**. Kerns's Fort was on his land. He built the first mill in the county, and had a boat-yard at the mouth of Decker's creek, to accommodate migration to Kentucky..."

From another work, "... Under the heading of "Town Established" "The General Assembly, in October 1785, established Morgans-Town by an act reading as follows:"

"Be it enacted . . . . vested in Samuel Hanway, John Evans, David Scott, **Michael Kerns** and James Daugherty, gentlemen trustees, to be by them or any three of them laid out in lots of half an acre each, with convenient streets, which shall be and the same are hereby, established a town 'by the name of Morganstown."

Later on p. 598 in the section on Morgantown Borough, Wiley writes of Greenmont saying that it "consists of private dwellings, and was so named by George M. Hagans. It includes the Morgantown Mills, the old Kern's Fort site and the fair

ground. It was never laid out in regular streets, beyond the projection of one called Prairier, but never opened. Its population, in 1883, is ninety."

On the next page (599) Wiley writes that Morgantowns was established in 1785 and that **Michael Kern** purchased lots 39 and 40..."

We believe and need to research the theory that **Barbara Weedman Riffle Kern** is buried in or near Morganstown along side her second husband. Interesting, one of the children of **Nicholas** and **Barbara** (**Weedman**) **Riffle**, **Jacob Riffle** had a son in 1820, which he named **Michael Kern Riffle**.

Any volunteers to do some research on possible burial sites for **Michael** and **Barbara Weedman Kern** would be appreciated.

church the people of Weedman church had assembled a historical display of the church's beginning, the first members, the deed by which John Weedman, local banker, had given the land for the church. In his honor they called it the **Weedman** Methodist Church and so it is to this day. It was a truly spiritual experience to attend that church. We could almost feel the presence of the early area Weedmans and kin who attended the church. Rev. Dr. William L. Weedman, of Springfield, IL, gave a wonderful sermon and lead the service; we each got a souvenir bulletin of the day's service, and a sixpage write-up of the church history. Several of us formed a "choir" and we sang, Beulah Land, an old time favorite no doubt sung often when the first Weedmans built and attended. Our thanks go out to **Dr. Weedman** for planning and conducting the service. And, we must pass a special thanks to Rev. Louella Pence, the pastor at the Weedman United Methodist Church for participating in the service and allowing us the use of all of the Church facilities. We used the sanctuary and the grounds for our box lunch following the service. And, members of the Church served as musicians for our service. It was truly a great day.

We had a box lunch on the lawn of the church. We could easily imagine the early days when folks spent a good part of Sundays at the church, out on the lawn for socials, and picnics for various kinds. Revival, missionary meetings...the church was and IS a vibrant living memorial to our Weedman past in Illinois.

#### **Cemetery Tour**

The service was followed by a tour of the local cemeteries in which Weedmans and kin are buried. We went to the **Miller Cemetery** in McLean County where the

progenitors of the Illinois line, George and Charlotte (Huhn) Weedman, are buried. Shiloh Cemetery was next and that is where a lot of the Rutledge and Bishop family are at rest including two daughters of George and Charlotte Weedman. Historic Campground Cemetery in Farmer City was next. There are so many family members buried here that it could have well be called the Weedman Cemetery! The last two visited were City Cemetery and Maple Grove Cemetery both in Farmer City.

#### Weedman Family Hall of Fame

Catherine Bishop Weedman, who was the maternal head of a family which produced a large number of medical and dental practitioners in the 1800s. **Dr. James Clyde Munch**, a Farmer City, IL native who achieved recognition and prominence in the field of pharmacology.

George Perry Weedman, a native of Perry Co., IN who made significant contributions to the field of education and who was an early superintendent of schools in Perry County.

Living person awards were made to:

**Dee Brown**, author and historian who is best known for writing the book, *Bury My Heart at Wounded Knee*. His wife is a Weedman descendent.

Gena Lee Theiss, author and genealogist who compiled the work, *Christian Weedman and his Descendents*, 1735-1986 and a later supplement.

Marianne Montgomery, who along with her late husband, Paul Kasper Montgomery, started the *Weedman Newsletter* and who has been its editor for the entire 32 plus years of publication.

**Dr. Daniel W. Weedman**, astronomer who has numerous scientific publications and who co-invented the Hobby Eberly Telescope.

#### Malinda Weedman Riddle

Daughter of Daniel and Nancy (Spurrier) Weedman By Myron Riddle

The story that was relayed to me was, after the death of her husband in 1869, Ma**linda** stayed at Derby Indiana until about 1880 when she and her surviving children left Indiana to homestead land in the Northwest, Washington State, I have been told that Malinda, my GG grandfather Henry Washington, Lavina Belle, Margaret Ann (she married a Doctor by the name of J. W. Mullinix), Lavina Belle (she married a Mr. Reed) and Mary Elizabeth. Mary Elizabeth as I understand it was already married to a Splater and that was with whom Malinda traveled west. In the same cemetery as Malinda are three of her grandchildren who had passed away in 1891, a daughter and twins in 1893. Close by the gravesite is the grave of a Ulysses Riddle whose identity is elusive at this point.

I am in hopes that someone in the Weedman family has additional information concerning the time Malinda spent at Derby, Perry County Indiana between 1869 and 1880. I do know that **Elisha Wells Riddle** is a twin brother of Margaret Ann and he passed away at 9 years of age. I have been unable to find out any information on **George McLane Riddle** other than his birth date.

Malinda Weedman, daughter of Daniel and Nancy (Spurrier) Weedman, was born 31 March 1833 in Perry County, IN and married William H. Riddle there on 27 March 1859. She died 20 November 1888 and is buried in Waitsburg, WA. Myron Riddle of Sacramento, CA provided the information above as well as a photograph of the tombstone of Malinda. #### Philip Weedman Florida Land Grant

Land grants which have been printed in "Grassroots in America, Index to American State Papers", shows **Philip Weedman** of the Florida branch of the family obtaining land near St. Augustine. Philip or Felipe was the progenitor of this branch of the family. This activity may have been his earliest acquisition of land in Florida.

July 3, 1811 – **Philip Weedman** presented his memorial for 150 acres of land on the road to Picolata, 12 miles north of St. Augustine. Date could have been 1819. *Vol. 3, page 780*.

5 July 1815. 150 acres on the road to Picolata presented to **Philip Weedman**, a citizen of the U.S. and resident of the Territory of Florida bounded on the east by Turnbull Creek. 400 acres were requested but 150 acres granted. **Don Philip Weedman** was the name used on the application. *Vol. 4, page 307*.

Joyce would like to go further back on the BISHOP lines of **Jacob Bishop Jr.**, born 25 June 1797, son of **Jacob Bishop** and **Hannah (Cooper) Bishop**.

Jacob Sr. was born in Maryland, to the best of our knowledge, and died in Randolph Twp., McLean Co., IL. The name may have been BISCHOFF when or if Jacob came from Germany, which many believe. The name was changed to the English spelling of the name. Jacob Jr. married Mary Ann Weedman. It is possible that they met in Fayette Co., PA, or in Perry or Licking Co., OH. Catherine Bishop who married Jacob Weedman was a sister of Jacob Bishop Jr. and the Neil Munch (George's line) is descended from her. If anyone has gone back on the Bishop line further than

#### James Edwin Weedman

Much of his information was collected during a visit in early 1994 with **Steve** Fairfield of Hemet, California. Steve's grandfather was **James Edwin Weedman** and remembers him well. Steve was kind enough to allow us to visit and answer many questions about the family.

As with all families, there were good times and bad times. Steve shared much of memories of both with us and while this is intended to document the visit, it will be edited to the extent which Mr. Fairfield desires.

James Edwin Weedman

James Edwin Weedman was born 21 July 1852 in Meade County, Kentucky and was the oldest child of Addison Meriwether and Louisa (Brown) Weedman. According to family tradition and to the biographical sketch printed in the Meade County history, James left Kentucky in 1876 to seek his fortunes in California.

According to Steve Fairfield, James claimed he was not actually a Weedman but rather an adopted child and was born a Richardson. A check of court records in Meade County may provide a clue as to the validity of this. But James and his son, Charles, both stated he was not a Weedman.

A portion of a biographical sketch on **Addison M. Weedman** from a history of Meade County, Kentucky is quoted in part:

"...A. M. Weedman was born October 2, 1526 in Breckinridge County between Stephensport and Holt's Bottom on the river, where, and in Perry County, Indiana, he resided until about 1848, when he moved to Meade County and located

on the same farm where he now resides. His father, Stephen Weedman was born near Leitchfield, Grayson County, in 1806 .... October 18, 1851, Mr. Weedman married Miss Louisa, daughter of William and Nancy (Lasley) Brown of Nelson County. To them have been born James E., who emigrated to California in 1876, . and in 1882 married Mrs. Rowena Ball of Humboldt County..."

While not actual proof, the sketch does indicate that James E was a natural, born child of **Addison** and **Louisa Brown** Weedman.

Steve thinks that there is a tradition about a family taking in James during his trek to California and maybe this was the Richardson family in question. He can also remember James going back east (maybe to Indiana) to try to collect an inheritance but he was ruled out. Could this have been the connection? It is not known.

James married Rowena Crank Toll, the widow of W. R. Toll on 6 August 1882 in Humboldt County, California. Rowena was born 12 February 1859 in Scio, Linn County, Oregon and was the daughter of Joseph Wesley and Minerva (Prevett) Crank.

Toll was a photographer and died young of tuberculosis. There was one child of the marriage of **W. R.** and **Rowena Crank Toll** but no information is available on that off-spring. (It is believed that records gathered from the LDS archives gives more information on the Crank family and possibly the child in question).

Rowena Crank Weedman died 10 September 1891 and in the nine years of marriage had four children:

- **-Lillian**. Born May 1884 and married **Mr. Fairfield**. Steve's mother.
- **-Patrick**. Born 1887 and died prior to 1900 (per Steve Fairfield)
- -Charles E. Born 12 January 1882 in Humboldt Co.
- -Pearl. Born 1889, in Humboldt Co.

After the death of Rowena, James was unable to keep the family together. As evidenced by the 1900 census, each of the children was in the home of another person although Patrick cannot be located in that census. It is likely that he died in that year or 1899.

According to Mr. Fairfield, James was a person who was always seeking a fortune. He owned land in Hemet but spent time in different places in California. He seemed to know the best places to live. We recently found that James obtained two land grants in Humboldt and Mendocino Counties according to California land records.

These grants were as follows:

1 Oct 1879, Humboldt County, Cash Sale, T004S R003E S35 (legal description of the land with T being township, R being range, and S being section number).

18 Oct 1889, Mendocino County, Cash sale, T005S R003E S34 18 Oct 1889, Mendocino County, Cash sale, T005S R003E S34 4 Aug 1890, Mendocino County, Homestead, T005S R003E S34

It is unclear how much land was involved in each of these.

Although James was the grandfather of Steve, the relationship was not terribly friendly. James came to live with the family which was in the Hemet area on a farm in the early 1930s. Times were

tough and it was difficult to make a living. Grandfather Weedman seemed to be demanding and it told on the health of his oldest daughter, Lillian Fairfield. This obviously caused ill feelings.

James died in Riverside County about 1934 and is buried there in an unmarked grave. His death occurred in a home for the elderly in that county.

#### Patrick Weedman

Patrick Weedman was born after the 1880 census and had died prior to the 1900 census. According to Mr. Fairfield, Patrick went to live and work on a dairy farm near Humboldt and died when he was 12-14 years old. He could have been poorly cared for and the neglect may have contributed to his death. Steve says Patrick is probably buried in the Garberville Cemetery in Garberville, Humboldt Co., California.

#### Pearl Weedman

**Pearl Weedman** married more than once and lived in Portland Oregon. She prospered and had a fire rating business in that city. One husband was **Earl Goodman.** There were no natural born children born to Pearl. Nothing further was discussed about Pearl.

#### Lillian Weedman

Lillian Weedman married a Mr. Fair-field. It was revealed that Mr. Fairfield worked on farms in the Hemet area and had a small ranch at one time. There were two children of this marriage:

Stephen Francis, born in 1918, and Jean Marie, born in 1927.

Stephen married **Helen G. Sowers** in 1947 and they had two children: Donna

Jean born in 1949 and Peggy Ann born in 1953. Donna married Patrick Moore and they have two children who live in Hilo, Hawaii. Peggy Ann married Dennis Henner and they have one child, a son, born in 1989. The family lives in Kapaau, Hawaii.

Stephen founded Steve's Auto Parts in 1947 and his business grew to a four store chain before he sold out in 1968. He then went into the book business operating Hungry Eve Books which sold new and used books as well as publishing of local history books. He closed the book store in 1986 but remains in the antiquarian book business.

Jean Marie Fairfield married Chester M. Roistacher and they live in Riverside, CA. She is a retired school principal and Chester is a retired citrus scientist. They have five children: Marc, Leslie, Robin, Sandy, and Dawn.

#### Charles E. Weedman

**Charles E. Weedman** was born January 12, 1882 in Humboldt County, California. After the death of Rowena, Charles became an apprentice to a blacksmith.

Charles never married but was romantic with a daughter of **John Vance** on whose ranch Charles lived and managed.

In his life, he was a partner with a **Colonel Maxwell** in a firm which built buses in Ferndale, California. The buses ran from Garberville to Eureka and beyond. Charles owned most of the stock in the bus company but Colonel Maxwell was the "front man". Charles was well adept at the mechanical side of things and was happy with the arrangement. The firm prospered to the point they were bought out by Pickwick Motor Stages, a bus firm which had routes on the West Coast from Canada to Mexico. In addition, they had hotels at the major stops and were seen to be a successful company.

But, the Depression came and Pickwick was in too much debt. The stock with **Charles Weedman** took for his share of the bus company he helped to found was soon worthless. The remains of the company was purchased by Greyhound and Charles remained as a shop foreman there for many years in Eureka.

Prior to the bus business, Charles was the operating engineer at La Grange mine in Weaverville, CA. In this business he built a giant monitor which washed the mountains to expose minerals and that monitor was all his handiwork except for the base which was cast by a foundry. This monitor sits along the highway going into Weaverville and is a California State Historical Monument.

Charles died 19 November 1972 at Carlotta, Humboldt County, CA. On his death certificate was the name of Steve Fairfield whom we contacted to obtain information on the family.

With the death of Charles who died without any offspring, the Weedman name from this line (Charles, James Edwin, Addison M., Stephen, Christian Jr., Christian Sr.) ended.

We are indebted to Mr. Fairfield for sharing information on this line of the Weedman family and for providing pictures of James E. Weedman, pictures of buses built by Charles E. Weedman's firm and other memorabilia.

A separate paper which contains a picture of James Edwin Weedman, pictures of the buses built by Charles E. Weedman, and a stock certificate owned by Charles Weedman has been prepared and is available on request. We did not attempt to duplicate those here because pictures do not copy well with the printing systems we use.

We promised some time ago to print the story of James Edwin Weedman and his family and apologize for taking so long to finally get the job done.
